

Statement by NIHR on Bahraini Women's Day

Manama on December 1, 2021

On the December 1 every year, the Kingdom of Bahrain celebrates a distinct national occasion, that is the Bahraini Women's Day, to recall the great role of Bahraini women in contributing to the building and development of Bahraini society through their giving over decades of work to advance various aspects of life, and to define their prominent role that transcended local borders to reach regional and international forums, where women have become an example to follow-up due to their prominent and distinguished role at various levels.

This year's occasion is celebrated under the theme "Bahraini Women in the National Development, a March of Progress in a Dedicated Nation", in honour of the role of Bahraini women, which harmonises with the longstanding presence of women in the national building processes, given the depth of that presence historically, and in view of its gradual, orderly and coordinated development with the progress of the modern Bahraini civil State based on justice and equality in rights and duties between citizens, both men and women.
