

National Institution for Human Rights expresses regret over the death of a member of the security forces of the Ministry of Interior

National Institution for Human Rights expresses its deep sadness and regret over the death of the policeman Abduwahid Alsayed Mohammad a security marshalling man of the Ministry of Interior and injuring a number of security men on Friday, February 14, 2014 as a result of the explosion occurred in Al Dair area during the performance of their duty to secure the roads and protect citizens and public and private property.

National Institution for Human Rights also strongly deplores the illegal acts witnessed by the Kingdom of Bahrain during the last three days of cars detonation in densely populated places in the capital Manama and surrounding areas targeting the lives of security men and innocent people, destabilizing security and stability, terrorizing citizens and residents and threatening national peace and security.

National Institution for Human Rights calls on the various civil society organizations to the necessity to take stances and unvarying and effective procedures to stop the illegal acts and stand firm in the face of these frivolous actions tampering the security of the homeland and the citizen, which contravene the values and principles of the Islamic religion, and all international norms, conventions, treaties and are alien to the Bahraini community known for its love, tolerance and rejection of violence and extremism.



National Institution for Human Rights expresses its confidence in the efficiency of the security forces to counter the illegal actions that aim to promote violence and sow discord in the peaceful Bahraini society. The confidence of the Institution extends to the awareness and vigilance of the people of the Kingdom of Bahrain and their adherence to national unity and renouncing terrorism in thought and practice.

National Institution for Human Rights urges all parties to the reunion and to promote national unity and citizenship values and strengthen social cohesion and peaceful coexistence among the various Bahraini groups and sects.

National Institution for Human Rights extends condolences and sympathy to the family of the policeman, praying to the Almighty to inspire his family patience and fortitude, and wish a speedy recovery to the injured in this tragic incident.
