

## Statement by NIHR on International Workers' Day

## Manama on 1 May 2020

On May 1 every year, the Kingdom of Bahrain joins the international community in celebrating the International Workers' Day in recognition of workers' efforts and in honour of their sincere hands and contributions in various labour sectors.
