Human Rights Office Opens in Bahrain that works round the clock

Dr. Ahmed Abdullah Farhan, the NIHR Secretary-General said the NIHR will open its latest office in Bahrain in the next two months to receive complaints through a 24-hour hotline.

Dr. Farhan said in a statement to the Gulf Daily News published today that the NIHR will fully work at their offices at the Seef District.

Dr. Farhan said that legal experts would be recruited to assist in dealing with rights abuse cases across four different categories - civil and political rights, social and media rights, international relations and national institutions.

He added that they would offer advice to victims, while a division is also being established to receive individual complaints round the clock from people who feel their rights have been violated.

The NIHR will embark on employing at least 60 staff members. The NIHR is run by a Council of 20 permanent members appointed by a Royal Decree by His Majesty the King in 2009.
